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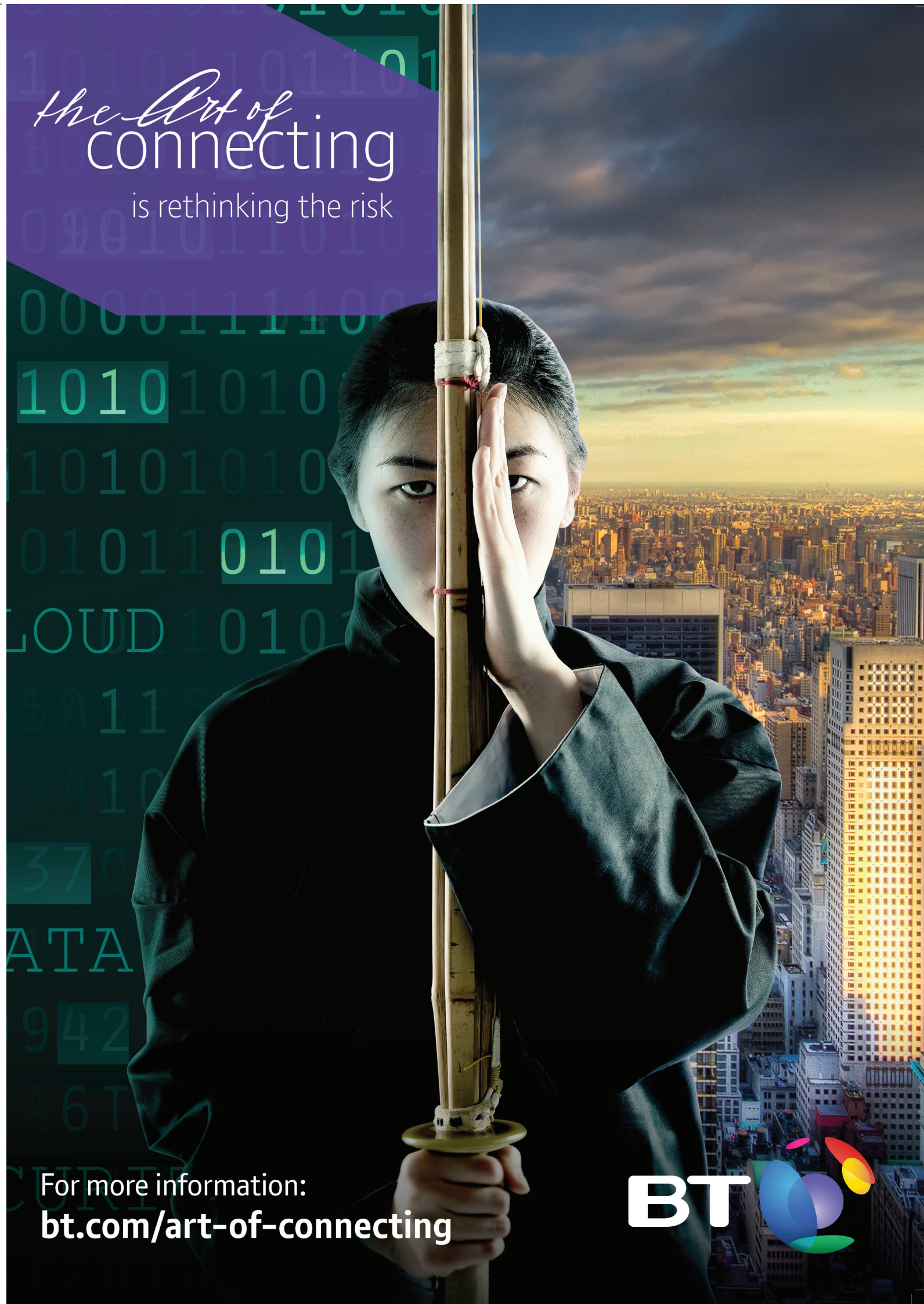

Honourable Ministers, colleagues and friends,

I am delighted to welcome you to the **Commonwealth Cybersecurity Forum 2015**.

This year's event - the fifth conference on cybersecurity convened by the Commonwealth Telecommunications Organisation since 2010 - aims to provide delegates with an opportunity to focus particularly on the social and economic significance of cybersecurity and resilience. The Internet has fundamentally changed both the amount of information that people can access, and also the ways through which they access it. However, this brings with it many threats, and therefore the safety, security and resilience of the Internet is of considerable importance for successful social and economic development. Governments, companies, civil society and users all have a shared responsibility in safeguarding the freedom of the Internet.

The shared values of the Commonwealth, focusing especially on democracy, good governance and consensus, provide a strong foundation to determine guidelines for effective Internet governance. These principles encapsulate four overarching principles guiding Commonwealth countries to ensure that robust and secure strategies are in place to combat malicious cyber activities, and protect critical infrastructure.

This Forum provides participants with an opportunity to exchange ideas, share knowledge, and build relationships with peers from across the Commonwealth and beyond. I very much hope that the experiences gained through participation in it will enable us all to redouble our efforts to ensure that the Internet will remain a powerful tool for ensuring effective social and economic development.

I wish you a very successful **Commonwealth Cybersecurity Forum 2015**.
